

This park is surrounded by some of Tokyo's major sports facilities such as the National Stadium and Jingu Ballpark as well as the

Meiji-Jingu forest. The National Stadium was constructed to be the main stadium for the Tokyo Olympics held in 1964.

A high platform in this asphalt Kasumigaoka plaza plaza works as an outdoor stage. It is used for gatherings and events.

Statues were Olympic memorial sculptures erected in the

park in commemoration of the Tokyo Olympics. Those are of Baron Pierre de Coubertin of France, father of the modern Olympic Games, and Jigoro Kano, Judo player and educator who founded Kodokan and contributed to the popularization of Judo.


Neighboring highlights
